NATURE HEALS —Melissa Burdick, Executive Director

Late last year The Brenton Arboretum's board and staff set out on a mission to evaluate and strengthen our commitment to our mission. The process was as much a journey of self-discovery as it was an institutional exercise. We affirmed that yes, our mission to *inspire joy through the beauty and knowledge of the natural world of trees* is as sound as it has ever. The process of exploring our heart and soul uncovered an even deeper motivation. Working together to articulate this "higher purpose," we crafted a statement that is equal parts practical and aspirational:

Understanding nature heals, The Brenton Arboretum provides a tree sanctuary all can explore to find joy, renew their energy, refresh their spirit, and feel better. Our tree collection inspires an appreciation for nature and contributes to scientific research on the importance of trees to environmental, personal, and community health.

Testing The New –Andy Schmitz, Director of Horticulture

The canvas is clean, the brushes are new and the paint is ready to come to life. Or in the case of the arboretum, the space is opened up, the shovels have been sharpened and the trees are waiting eagerly to be planted. A colleague once said to me, "the chainsaw will be your paint brush." Well, one the arboreums "paint brushes" wore out last year after so much use.

The non-native and invasive pest, the emerald ash borer, *Agrilus planipennis* has wiped out most of the ash, *Fraxinus* collection north of the Maintenance Building. Though the blue ash, *Fraxinus quadrangulata* remain, as they are the least preferred ash species by the borer but in time, the chainsaw will be fired up again. The green ash, *Fraxinus pennsylvanica*, black ash, *Fraxinus nigra* and the white ash *Fraxinus americana* are all but ashes on the brush pile. We are truly watching a genus go extinct before our eyes. But with this, comes the opportunity to plant new species at the arboretum and this spring is that time.

The holes left vacant by the ash trees will soon be faded memories as they are replaced with oak, *Quercus* species new to the arboretum. Oaks like, wavyleaf oak, *Quercus undulata*, Gambel oak, *Quercus gambelii*, netleaf oak, *Quercus rugosa*, Arizona white oak,

Shrub Oak, *Quercus turbinella*

Quercus arizonica, southern red oak, *Quercus falcata*, gray oak, *Quercus grisea*, Arkansas oak, *Quercus arkansana*, shrub oak, *Quercus turbinella* and Lacey oak, *Quercus laceyi*. These are all southern United States species and were wild collected when I crossed Texas with a group during the International Oak Society Conference in the fall of 2022. Now, one year old seedlings are ready to planted and take their chances at surviving Iowa's winter. The wavyleaf oak and the Gambel oak grown from southwest Colorado wild seed sources have already survived three winters in Iowa. Now, we will find out if some Texas genetics like or dislike Iowa. Being wild collected seed, we know the exact location it was collected and

with this we know the soil type, associated species and elevation. So, no matter if these new oaks live or die, we learn something. If they die, we learn that during future collecting trips, we need to collect seed from higher or lower elevations, on different facing slopes or on different soils to trial them again in Iowa.

This is what the arboretum is all about, testing and trying new species to see what might just survive here. The next time you are at the arboretum take a look at these new little oak trees because in actuality you may only get this year to see them.
